The City Council agreed yesterday to boost efforts to develop an African-American heritage museum.

The council authorized \$25,000 in community block grant money to hire a consultant to assess space needs, possible sites, costs and management options for the museum.

Since November, a group of black activists has occupied Colman school to pressure the city to use the abandoned school for an African-American Heritage Museum. The city, however, maintains the school would be a poor site for a museum.
